A multidisciplinary team provides expert gentle care to individuals with serious, progressive illness when cure is not expected, including caregiver support and bereavement support.

Advanced Health Care Directives

- Choose your level of care and communicate your choices to family and medical professionals. Connect with the "Team".
- With the right support and information patients and families can expect comfort care and quality of life in their care setting.
- Referrals are often made by family physicians, but individuals can access the Hospice Palliative team by self referral, or by talking to nursing staff.

Palliative Care Emergencies

At any time during the course of advanced illness, sudden changes can occur. If patients have uncontrolled pain or nausea, difficult breathing, bleeding or seizures, professional medical care is needed. For patients at home please follow the steps below.

1. Call the Family Dr.
2. Call your Home Care Nurse (8:00am to 9:00pm)
3. Go to the Emergency Dept.

Many patients can return to care at home once symptoms are stabilized.
